New Book on First African-American Automotive Pioneers

C.R. Patterson & Sons Company Credited with Being First African-American Automobile Manufacturers in United States

MOUNT VERNON, N.Y. – In <u>First Black Autos</u> (Stalwart Publications), retired New York City educator Henry May illustrates the struggles and triumphs of Greenfield, Ohio's Patterson family and traces the story of America's first African-American automobile manufacturer.

The book examines the life of Charles Richard "C.R." Patterson, an escaped slave who traveled from West Virginia to the "free state" of Ohio. C.R.'s blacksmithing skills brought him financial success and he eventually launched his own company, C.R. Patterson & Sons, manufacturing carriages and horse-drawn vehicles. His son Frederick Douglas Patterson led the company into a new era after C.R.'s death with the design and manufacturing of the first Patterson-Greenfield sports coupe in 1915.

Henry May describes the Patterson family's efforts to operate a racially diverse business during segregation, and the difficulties endured from evolving national automotive standards and by competition from automaker Henry Ford. Mr. May takes the existing documentation and facts regarding that era and creates a cohesive picture for the reader.

<u>First Black Autos</u> grew from family research. Mr. May's mother, the late Ernestine May would recount tales of her youth, traveling from Tuskegee, Alabama with her mother to Greenfield, OH to visit Aunt Estalene (Frederick Patterson's wife). As children they would play in and around the Patterson automobile factory. It was Mr. May's curiosity and inability to find cohesive information available on these incredible pioneers that resulted in <u>First Black Autos</u>.


Mr. May was born in Queens, NY during the Great Depression and raised in Harlem surrounded by the arts in his community and in his home. He is a graduate of New York University, has served in the United States Army and is a Korean War veteran. Mr. May is active in his community of Mount Vernon, NY. He is a Board Member of the Audubon-BRASS society and a founding member of the Mount Vernon Parent and Community Forum on Education - a grassroots parent involvement organization.

"Writing has always been a form of personal expression and stress relief for me," says Henry.
"When I decided to write a memoir entitled <u>Walk Awhile With Me...</u> on the life of my mother,
Sweethearts of Rhythm swing band pianist and composer Ernestine May, I joined the dynamic
Martin Simmons Writers Workshop at the Frederick Douglas Creative Arts Center in Manhattan
to further develop my writing skills." There he was encouraged and challenged by published
poets and authors including the late Martin Simmons, Jaira Placide and Quincy Troupe who
questioned and critiqued his work.

One workshop session in particular planted a seed for what would become Henry May's first major work. While reading aloud a chapter on Ernestine's childhood, Henry mentioned "travels north from dusty Alabama to Greenfield, Ohio... we would stay with our aunt and spend our days playing in the car factory." This tidbit resonated with many of the writers. "A Black car manufacturer? I've never heard of such a thing! Tell us more!" Henry took a detour from his mother's memoir and began to gather facts and information about the Patterson family. Few could be found. Realizing there was no existing book or resource on the topic, Henry accepted a challenge from the writers group to create one, and First Black Autos was born.


